## Service Spotlight

Respite services are designed to support the primary caregivers and provide periodic relief. **Statewide, HEMOCARE provides Respite for over 150 individuals and caregivers.**

Respite enables the caregiver to have planned time for herself or to have time with other family members. Services can be provided in either planned or emergency situations. Respite can also be utilized during school hours when the consumer is not able to attend school due to sickness.

Respite may be provided in or out of the home and can be overnight, on weekends, or in emergency situations. In order to receive Respite, the caregiver must live at the same address as the consumer. This service is not available to those who receive Residential Supports or live in Alternative Family Living Homes (AFLs).

Currently, HEMOCARE provides Respite services to 108
